# PRESENTATION

VIDA YOUTH is a European Project approved under the Erasmus+ Program, included in KA2 – Call (2016) Cooperation for Innovation and the Exchange of Good Practices Strategic Partnerships for youth.

## AIMS

VIDA YOUTH aims to share and disseminate best practice and non-formal educational activities in order to prevent the causes of the violence among young people (13-18 years) involving both potential aggressors and victims.

- 1 According to the horizontal priority "Inclusive education, training and youth", the project will address formal and non-formal education and training in order to tackle bullying and violence outside schools, moreover, the educational process will focus on the development of social and civic consciousness; the project will also provide useful inputs to avoid potential dangerous situations to weak people making the education the most inclusive possible.
  - 1.1 Support youth workers, trainers and teachers, in developing and sharing effective methods to reach people in need.
  - 1.2 Support youth workers in developing and sharing effective methods in reaching out disadvantaged young people.
  - 1.3 Promote cross sectorial cooperation between youth workers actors including high educational institutions, public institutions, small enterprises and NGOs.
  - 1.4 Professionalize youth workers, developing their competences and skills in the field of youth violence prevention.
  - 1.5 Foster the inclusion promoting intercultural dialogue and strengthen knowledge and acceptance of diversity in society.

## AIMS

- 2 According to the sectorial priority "Promoting empowerment, open it to cross-sectorial cooperation and active citizenship of young people", the project will promote diversity, intercultural and inter-religious dialogue, common values of freedom, tolerance and respect of the weaker and contributing in the development of their belonging in society.
  - 2.1 Improvement of the problem awareness.
  - 2.2 Improvement of relationships skills, knowledge about specific rules, behavior, laws and concept related with civic education and tolerance values in general and into a relationship.
  - 2.3 Improvement of personal sense of security and their confidence to recognize potential dangerous situations learning how to avoid and react in the right way so as to raise their sense of security.
  - 2.4 Increasing the formal education system attention on the topic.



# IMPLEMENTATION

The intervention with youth will take 9 hours of classroom activities, adding some assessment activities before and after the intervention.

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- 2 Sample: a minimum of 50 people from each country.
- 3 Contents of the intervention: Awareness raising, causes of youth violence, consequences of violence, tolerance and civic values, gender equality, systems for notifications, social and health problems related to violence, relationship skills and how to prevent aggressions.
- 4 Initial assessment: May to June 2017.
- 5 Period of intervention: September to December 2017.
- 6 Final assessment: December 2017.

# Expected results

The FINAL RESULTS will be presented during the celebration of a workshop in Murcia, Spain (UCAM) in June 2018:

- 1 To edit a best practice guide for young people.
- 2 To edit a didactic program with different learning and teaching systems to include the topics of interest within the programmed learning activities of the students.

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# WHAT IS THE OPRI

The International Project Office (OPRI) is an office linked to the Vice-rectorate of Research, responsible for the management of international research projects at UCAM. The OPRI was founded to strengthen the collaboration between our partners all around the world in the field of research. The unit was established in 2012 and has built strong alliances in 36 countries in which the university has to date participated in 41 projects. The internationalization of the Catholic University of Saint Anthony, through the OPRI, is directed towards all of the university community, researchers as well as students. A total of 160 students have participated already in projects in a variety of countries all over the continent.

Currently we are leading international projects like "EUROLAB-4HPC", "ACDDTHPC" and "Discovery of novel blood anticoagulants using hybrid artificial intelligence techniques" in the area of computational bioinformatics inside the calls Horizon 2020, 7FP and NILS. UCAM also has been awarded a postdoctoral Marie Curie with the project "POCBIOPEP" related to the study of cellular markers in blood from the intake of POrk Cured BIOactive PEPTides. Likewise, the UCAM, recognized by European institutions for its work in research and management of sports projects, such as dual career (education + sport) is coordinating the projects "ESTPORT" and "SPIIS" inside the call Erasmus+ Sport.
